


Comorbidity


- Comorbidity of mental health and substance use problems is common in Canada (Rush et al., 2008)
- 35.6% of individuals admitted to inpatient mental health have co-occurring disorders (CIHI, 2013)
- Epidemiological data suggest that at least 20% of individuals with a substance use disorder experience comorbid mood/anxiety disorders (Grant et al., 2004)
- Comorbidity is recognized as highly prevalent by general public (Hudson et al., 2018)
- These individuals often seek support and treatment from multiple segregated services....How can we serve this population better?

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Treatment of Concurrent Disorders

- Sequential -- Treating one disorder prior to the other
- Simultaneous (Parallel) Receiving treatments for each disorder separately but at the same time
- Simultaneous (Integrated) Receiving treatment for both disorders from integrated programs/ services at the same time GOLD STANDARD

 - Comorbid MH and SU
- Multidisciplinary team; Holistic services
- ** 279 youth since spring 2015

Community Mental Health and Addictions


- Four sites with co-located services
- Collaboration (e.g., co-facilitating groups)








 - Multidirectional sharing**




- Be better knowledge *users* & establish ourselves as knowledge *creators*
